

### Belle Fourche, SD

- Founded in 1883 Incorporated in April 1903
- Population 5,848 (2022)
- In 1959, the <u>United States Coast and Geodetic Survey</u> officially designated a
  point 20 miles north of Belle Fourche as the <u>geographic center of the</u>
  <u>United States</u>.
- As of 2000 the median income for a household in the city was \$26,875, and the median income for a family was \$35,506.

### Belle Fourche History

- Belle Fourche, French for "beautiful fork", was named by French explorers from New France, referring to the confluence of what is now known as the Belle Fourche and Redwater Rivers and the Hay Creek.
- Knowing the cattle barons and the railroad would need a place to load cattle onto freight
  cars for shipment to packing plants in the Midwest, <u>Seth Bullock</u> effectively founded the city
  of Belle Fourche.
- Belle Fourche today serves a large trade area of ranches and farms. The wool, cattle, and <u>bentonite</u> industries have been important to the growth of Belle Fourche. The city serves as gateway to the northern Black Hills.
