

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP AT SCOTT PETERSON MOTORS

Human Resource Manager Kayla Grams reports on the new 'Start Today SD Apprenticeship Program' at Scott Peterson Motors. Registered Apprentices get on-the-job training while earning a paycheck.

Since the grant was awarded to Scott Peterson Motors, we have worked in conjunction with Rebecca Long, Labor Program Specialist in Workforce Training at the South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation to create an apprenticeship program which was then approved by the US Dept of Labor. Apprentices will work for a total of 4,000 hours or two years under a Master Certified Technician. During their time in the program apprentices will also attend online and in person classes to receive Ford or FCA certification (FCA – Fiat, Chrysler automobiles performance institute). At the end of the apprenticeship, apprentices will be Master Certified Technicians.

Being a registered apprenticeship site is important to Scott Peterson Motors because it allows for us to invest in the future of skilled workers in the automotive industry. Automotive Technicians are deeply needed in our state and region. Having the opportunity to invest in apprentices who may not have the opportunity to become certified due to the costs and time associated with the certification program. Being an apprentice allows an individual with no experience, but a desire and aptitude for mechanics, to become FCA or Ford trained and gain on the job



knowledge from several of the best certified technicians West River, who are journey workers at Scott Peterson Motors, with no out of pocket costs. Being a federally recognized apprenticeship site also allows for men and woman who have served our country in the Armed Forces to enroll as an apprentice and have access to their GI Bill benefits while an apprentice.



Post-secondary education is an important step for students graduating high school, but traditional university is not always the best option or fit for everyone. Apprenticeships create an opportunity to learn a skilled trade without accumulating college debt and with minimal time to transition into a career. Scott Peterson Motors believes the apprenticeship is an additional

way to invest in our community and the future service experience for our customers. Currently, Scott Peterson Motors has three registered apprentices taking part in the program.

The group shared community development goals being met and insights for the future of Belle Fourche.


